SFU Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarship Program

- Awarded 95 scholarships that ranged in value from \$10,000 up to an amount to cover tuition and fees
- Students from 47 high schools across
 Metro Vancouver received a scholarship

Changes to deadlines

Application deadline: December 15, 2019

Document deadline: January 31, 2020

Other Funding

Entrance Awards and Bursaries

Application deadline <u>AND</u> document deadline:

April 30, 2020

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SFU Admission Principles

- Consistent with SFU values
- Tailored to faculties and programs
- Based on a comprehensive view of the student

Fall 2019 Debrief

- Admission applications by faculty
- English 70% requirement
- Admission exceptions

- 1. All approved Grade 11 and 12 courses matter
 - All approved courses are listed online:
 https://www.sfu.ca/students/admission/admission-requirements/approved-courses.html
- Complete a minimum of five approved grade
 12 courses
- 3. Focus on List A courses
- 4. Explore within List A and List B courses

Applying to TWO programs

- Take the required courses for both programs
- Use the Admissions Compass
- Evaluated on your primary program first, then alternate
 - Pay attention to requirements of alternate program
 - Many students did not meet requirements for alternate program

International Baccalaureate students

- Submit the IB Predicted Grades form
- 28-34 IB points required
- Certificate and Partial IB students may use IB courses in place of an approved List A and/or List B course
- IB courses with direct course equivalents will be used as such
- IB courses with subject area equivalents may be used as List A and/or List B, depending on program

Advanced Placement courses

- AP courses may be in used in place of an approved Grade 12 List A and/or List B course
- AP courses with direct course equivalents will be used as such
- AP courses with subject area equivalents may be used as List A and/or List B, depending on program
- Equivalency table on website

Self-Reporting Grades

All students (except Beedie, SEE, & Scholarship applicants) must self-report their grades by **March 15, 2020**

- Portal is open December 2nd
- Report final grade 11 and interim grade 12 marks
- Courses given external credit should be reported with a "TS" grade
- Grades for DL courses must be completed by January 31st

Student Transcript Service

- Self-reported grades still required
- Interim data will start to be received mid-March 2020 and on going
- Schools submit student grade information directly to Ministry of Education early, and often

Fall 2020 Admission Evaluation

Timeline

- Students self-report grades starting December 2nd,
 2020
- 2. Admission decisions begin early January, 2020
- 3. Application deadline January 31, 2020
- 4. Grade information received from Student Transcript Service mid-March and ongoing
- 5. Accept deadline May 1st & June 1st

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Diverse Qualifications

More than just grades...

- Possible option for students who do not meet the competitive admission evaluation
- Must meet minimum university admission requirements
- Submit Personal Information Profile (PIP) and one reference letter
- Document deadline: June 1, 2020

Aboriginal Admission Policy

Applicants must normally meet minimum SFU admission requirements & provide supporting documents:

- Supplemental Aboriginal Undergraduate Admission form
- Documentation of Aboriginal heritage
- One reference letter
- Document deadline: June 1, 2020

Alternate Routes to SFU

Partnership Programs

Douglas College and Langara College

Fraser International College (FIC)

- International students
- Specific pathway programs to SFU after 1 or 2 years

BC College Transfer

- Minimum 24 transferable units required
- Specific courses required for some programs
- May transfer a maximum of 60 units
- Associate Degree holders competitive admission average is 0.25 points lower

January 31st

- Receipt of all documents required for scholarship applicants
- Application for admission (all programs) closes
- Final grades for Distributed Learning (DL) courses

March 15th
